### **Nationally Renowned Grand Rapids Trauma Psychoanalyst Receives Michigan's Only Professional Recognition**

*Grand Rapids-based psychotherapist Dr. Richard Raubolt recognized by a national association*

GRAND RAPIDS, MI – Nationally renowned psychotherapist Dr. Richard Raubolt has been notified by the National Association for the Advancement of Psychoanalysis ([www.naap.org](http://www.naap.org)) that he has been officially recognized by the organization as a Psychoanalyst/Member, and is the only psychotherapist so designated in the state of Michigan.

Dr. Raubolt will also be recognized in the June issue of *Psychoanalytic Review* where his review of the eminent psychologist/psychoanalyst, Michael Eigen's, new book, *Flames from the Unconscious*, will be published. In this same issue, Dr. Raubolt's first book, *Power Games*, has earned a very favorable review.

Dr. Raubolt, a Grand Rapids-based psychologist and author, is an expert on treating trauma and anxiety. He is an innovative psychotherapist, lecturer and author recognized nationally for his leading edge work in the field of trauma and traumatic experiences. He has been in practice over 25 years and has served as a college professor for more than 20 years. He has published critically acclaimed books that have received national recognition, including *Theaters of Trauma: Dialogues for Healing* (2008) and *Power Games; Influence, Persuasion, and Indoctrination in Psychotherapy Training* (2006) which was a finalist for the Gradiva Award in the U.S. and the Goethe Prize in Canada.
